CONTEST DESCRIPTION DOCUMENT

51 – Industrial Mechanic (Millwright)

Post Secondary Level

(NOTE: Scope may change without notice)

PURPOSE OF THE CHALLENGE

DURATION: 6 Hours

Contestants will have the opportunity to show their knowledge and abilities in the Millwright trade while maintaining safe work practices and a positive attitude.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

PRACTICAL AND THEORY ON THE FOLLOWING

- **Machining** – Basic Lathe turning and Milling to close tolerances and finishes with drilling and tapping to specifications from a provided blueprint.
- **Precision Measuring** – Use of vernier calipers, inside micrometers, outside micrometers, depth gauges, height gauges and other tools used in the millwright trade.
- **Power Transmission** – Contestants will be required to work with and show an understanding of different types power transmission components including gears, pulleys, bearings and there lubrication. The ability to understand and calculate ratios will also be required.
- **Hydraulics and Pneumatics** – Circuit building and operation to specifications from a provided schematic with knowledge testing questions.

All registered apprentices in the Northwest Territories are welcome.
(Previous post-secondary schooling is not required).

ESSENTIAL SKILLS

Essential skills are used in nearly every job to varying degrees. They provide a foundation for learning all other skills and enable people to evolve with their jobs and adapt to workplace change. Good Essential Skills will help you understand and remember concepts introduced in technical training. The level of Essential Skills required for most trades is as high or higher than for many office jobs.
